The results of this study are published in Russell Dalton, Paula Garb, Nicholas Lovrich, John Pierce, and John Whiteley, *Critical Masses: Citizens, Nuclear Weapons Production, and Environmental Destruction in the United States and Russia* (Cambridge, MA: MIT Press, 1999). This is the english translation of the Russian survey, a slightly modified questionnaire was used in the Hanford survey. Some questions have a term in brackets at the end of the question; this denotes the source from which this question was drawn.
